NRA 3-P Sporter Air Rifle Postal Match for FFA Chapters

Purpose

This postal match offers all FFA members a shooting program designed to encourage and reward individual marksmanship skills.

Eligibility

An individual may enter this match only once per calendar year. Membership in the NRA is not required, but is encouraged.

Categories

Junior – 7th through 9th grade.
Senior – 10th through 12th grade.

Fees

\$5.00 per competitor.

Deadline Dates

Registration starts August 1st each calendar year. Firing may be conducted anytime after registration until May 1st. Score reporting forms must be received by May 7th to be considered for competition.

Rules

Current NRA Sporter Air Rifle Position Rules will govern. Rulebooks may be ordered by calling NRA sales at (800) 336-7402, or online at <http://materials.nrahq.org/go>. Request item number CA 16320.

Equipment

Sporter Air Rifle – Any type of compressed air or Co2 rifle of conventional appearance and with the additional restrictions in rule 3.2 of the NRA Sporter Air Rifle Position Rulebook.

Targets

NRA AR-5/10 targets are required. One shot may be fired on each record bull.

Witness

All record firing must be witnessed by an adult advisor.

Course of Fire

Thirty shots at 10 meters (33 feet)

10 Shots Prone in 15 minutes

10 Shots Standing in 20 minutes

10 Shots Kneeling in 15 minutes

Targets are to be shot in the order stated above. (Rule 7.1)

Scoring

Each target must be scored in accordance with NRA Sporter Air Rifle Rules 14.1 through 15.17.

Awards

State trophy plaques will be provided for first place in each category. Second through fifth places will receive awards based on participation. Additional awards will be provided for each additional ten competitors in each category per state.
