# 2010 NRA National Disabled Indoor Air Gun Championships

The NRA National Disabled Indoor Air Gun Championships give competitors with physical disabilities a chance to compete in a national event by comparing their scores with those fired in clubs all over the country. Scores are comparable because of the similar conditions existing in indoor ranges.

The NRA will conduct National Disabled Indoor Air Gun Sectionals in International Air Rifle, NRA Precision 3-Position Air Rifle and International Air Pistol beginning **January 15, 2010 and concluding March 31, 2010**. All results must be at the NRA no later than April 15, 2010. Any results received after the closing date will not be included in the 2010 National Disabled Indoor Championship Bulletin.

The 2010 National Disabled Indoor Air Gun Championships are determined by scores fired at local Sectional Tournaments, which are compiled at NRA Headquarters. For the purpose of the National Championships, the National Match Director requires that the top three individual's targets and the top team's targets be sent to NRA Headquarters for verification.

In order for a sectional to be valid there must be at least FIVE competitors. If less than five or only one team, there is no local sectional champion, but the scores may be submitted for classification as part of the National Disabled Indoor Championship results.

## I. GENERAL CONDITIONS

- Sectionals are registered matches. All guidelines for registered matches will be followed.
- Match sponsors are no longer required to ask for proof of NRA membership for any NRA Registered tournaments.
- Sectionals are operated by match staff composed of local officials.
- All local challenges and protests are resolved on the match site according to procedures outlines in the current NRA Rule Books.
- Competitors and sponsors are responsible for following the conditions set forth in this program.
- Unauthorized deviations to the program or NRA Rules may result in disqualification.
- Competitors and sponsors are responsible for the content of this program

**SOUVENIR PINS:** Each firing competitor, team and team captains, and match staff in the Sectional tournaments, will be awarded a souvenir pin to recognize their participation in the NRA Disabled Indoor Air Gun Sectional Championships. Pins are provided by NRA.

**BULLETIN:** Each competitor will receive a National Match Bulletin as soon as scores are compiled. The ranking of the scores will become final two weeks after the posted mailing of the official bulletin. All challenges and protests regarding the findings in the official bulletin must be filed with the National Rifle Association before the two weeks have elapsed.

**NOTICE:** All fired targets must be retained until the challenge period for the National Indoor Championship has ended, which is two weeks after the final results bulletin is mailed.

**RULES:** Current Rules as identified in each program section will apply. Rule books are available on line at: <http://www.nrahq.org/compete/nra-rule-books.asp>

**ELIGIBILITY:** A competitor (individual or team) may enter more than one Sectional tournament of each kind in 2010. However, the individual **MUST** declare before firing if the Sectional being fired is for score only or for the National Championships. If firing for score only the score card must be marked accordingly. Competitors may enter other types of Sectionals if eligibility limitations permit. **Competitors entered for “score only” are NOT eligible for awards in the local sectional or the National Championship.**

Competitors must be in possession of a medical waiver as described in Rule 13. Competitors in possession of a membership card with any disabled services organization such as the Paralyzed Veterans of America will be waived from complying with NRA Rule 13.

A foreign competitor is eligible to participate in the Sectional and National level (Rule 2.1.1), however, only U.S. citizens may win the First, Second and Third Place National Individual and Team Championship awards. A special high visitor award will be given.

**EQUIPMENT:** Competitors are responsible for providing their own equipment. Match sponsors take no responsibility for individual equipment.

**ENTRIES:** Entries should be submitted to your local sectional sponsor, not the NRA Headquarters.

**ENTRY CLOSING DATE:** Individual match entries must be received no later than the Monday preceding the opening date of the tournament. Team match entries may be made any time **prior** to the start of firing the team match.

**TEAM ENTRIES:** Team participation should be indicated on individual entry card. **Team entries must be made in person at the Statistical Office prior to the start of the match.**

**SCORE CARDS:** Special score cards will be used and must be signed by the competitor to be considered for the national bulletin.

**COACHING:** Rule 9.10 & 12.2, forbidding coaching on the firing line, will be enforced.

**TIES:** Ties will be broken by the method prescribed in the appropriate section of the Rule Book.

**CHALLENGES:** A challenge fee of up to \$3.00 will be charged for each challenge made. See Rule 16 for procedure.

**SIGHTING SHOTS:** Unlimited sighting shots will be allowed in all matches and at all stages and must be taken within the time limit.

**FIRING REGULATIONS FOR MATCHES:** Since Sectional scores are to be used to determine National Champions, all Sectionals **MUST** be conducted in the prescribed manner.

1. In the individual matches, if range facilities permit, two targets for the match may be mounted simultaneously, and an additional three minutes will be allowed for target change of the second stage or match as needed. When only a single target is mounted, due to range limitations, three (3) minutes for each target change will be added to the total firing time for the match.
2. Sighting shots: Unlimited number of sighting shots may be fired before the beginning of each match or position or anytime after changing targets for International, NRA 3-Position or NRA International Air Pistol matches.
3. Shooting Time: Time allowed includes sighting shots. Time remaining from one position may not be carried over to a following position regardless of the method of changing targets.
4. Firing Order: All matches (1,2,3,4) must be completed by all competitors on a relay before the next match is started.
5. Preparation Period: After record targets for a relay have been properly mounted, a five (5) minute preparation period will be given before the "Commence Firing" command.
6. Target height: Target height may be adjusted as needed to accommodate the competitors.

**FEES:** The fee payable to the NRA per competitor is \$7.50 per Championship and \$7.50 per team per Championship.

### **COMPETITOR CATEGORIES**

A junior \*, woman and senior\*\* award will be presented to the HIGH SENIOR, HIGH WOMAN AND HIGH JUNIOR in the National Individual Championship only.

\*Junior: An individual may also compete as Junior until December 31 of the calendar year in which the twentieth birthday occurs. (Rule 2.3)

\*\*Senior: A person may compete as a senior beginning on January 1 of the calendar year in which the 60<sup>th</sup> birthday occurs. (Rule 2.2.1)

## **II. COMPETITOR CLASSIFICATIONS**

**CLASSIFICATION:** Competitors will be classified based on Functional classification as described in the ISCD Shooting rules and Functional Classification 2005-2008 provided below.

Teams will be classified as SH1, SH2 or SH3, which is determined by the most team members from a given class.

### **12.3 Classes**

- 12.3.1 Competitors shall be classified into one of the three main classes SH1 SH2 and SH3, and within that class they will be allocated to a sub-class (strictly to determine the type of equipment the competitor will be permitted to use):

SH 1 : SH 1 A - SH 1 B - SH 1 C  
SH 2 : SH 2 Aa - SH 2 Ba - SH 2 Ca  
          SH 2 Ab - SH 2 Bb - SH 2 Cb  
SH 3 : SH 3 x - SH 3 A - SH 3 B - SH 3 C

### 12.3.2 Specifications class SH 1

Pistol- and rifle competitors who don't require a shooting stand.

These groupings of disabilities are to be used as a guide only and the functional classification panel can assess each case in their full shooting equipment in the shooting positions.

#### a. Class SH 1 A

Sitting competitors who are able to stand and have normal trunk functions. No backrest is allowed on the shooting chair. These competitors may choose to stand to compete if they wish.

#### b. Class SH 1 B

Sitting competitors who have non-functional lower limbs or severe problems in lower limbs and have good pelvis control (functional abdominal/spinal extensors, m.quadratus lumborum). A low backrest is allowed on the shooting chair.

#### c. Class SH 1 C

Sitting competitors with non-functional lower limbs or severe problems in lower limbs and fair/none trunk functions. A high backrest is allowed on the shooting chair.

### 12.3.3 Specifications class SH 2

Rifle competitors who have measurable and /or visible permanent disability in upper limbs and therefore are unable to support the weight of a rifle for the purpose of the competitions with their upper limbs and require a shooting stand.

These groupings of disabilities are to be used as a guide only and the functional classification panel can assess each case in their full shooting equipment in the shooting positions.

#### a. Class SH 2 A

Sitting competitors who have one non-functional upper limb or severe problems with both upper limbs and have normal trunk functions. No backrest is allowed on the shooting chair. These competitors may choose to stand to compete if they wish.

#### b. Class SH 2 B

Sitting competitors who have non-functional lower limbs or severe problems in lower limbs and have good pelvis control. A low backrest is allowed on the shooting chair.

#### c. Class SH 2 C

Sitting competitors who have non-functional lower limbs or severe problems in lower limbs and have fair/none trunk functions. A high backrest is allowed on the shooting chair.

*Note:* The high backrest is up to 10 cm below the armpits.

### 12.3.4 Specifications class SH 3 – Visually impaired

All shooters shall be classified into one valid class SH3x.

In case a SH3 shooter has additional disability as described in the ISCD rules for functional classification, the shooter may choose to shoot in sitting position and use a shooting chair in conformity with the ISCD rules for SH1 shooters.

In that case the shooter should be classified as SH3a, SH3b or SH3c

### III. INTERNATIONAL AIR RIFLE SECTIONAL MATCHES

**RULES:** Current NRA International Rifle Rules will govern.

**DISTANCE FIRED:** 10 meters

**RIFLE:** Air Rifle - Rule 3.6

**SIGHTS:** Metallic - Rule 3.7

**TARGETS:** NRA Official 10 meters; AR-5 series 2003 or later (or electronic target)

**INDIVIDUAL ENTRIES:** Open to Adults and Juniors with physical disabilities (NRA membership is not required.)

**TEAM ENTRIES:** Open to teams whose firing members represent a club affiliated with NRA (Rule 2.11 or 2.11.1), a Regular Service unit, National Guard, or Reserves (Rule 2.13), VA hospital or transition facility. A team composed of competitors who are not all in the same classification is a mixed team. Mixed team in sectionals may fire for score with the majority of classifications dictating their class.

A team will consist of three (3) firing members representing a club as defined by Rule 2.11, 2.13, or 2.14. Pick up teams composed of shooters who cannot prove membership in the same club or group (Rule 2.10), will not be allowed to participate. Since team matches are unfired (paper team match), all teams MUST be named and entered **BEFORE** any member of the team begins individual firing. Alternates must also be named before firing and used to substitute only for someone who has not yet fired.

**TIME LIMITS:** 60 Shots Standing = 105 Minutes (Note Rule 7.4(b)), to Include Sighting Shots.

#### **MATCH SCHEDULE:**

MATCH 1: Sectional Air Rifle Individual Championship.

MATCH 2: Sectional Air Rifle Team Championship. Total of firing member's scores will be taken from Match 1

MATCH 3: National Disabled Air Rifle Individual Championship. Scores will be taken from Match 1

MATCH 4: National Disabled Air Rifle Team Championship. Score will be taken from Match 2

***NOTE:** There is no entry fee for Matches 3 & 4. The entry is automatic with entry in Matches 1 & 2 of each Sectional Tournament.*

#### **INTERNATIONAL AIR RIFLE SECTIONAL AWARDS\*:**

MATCH 1: Sectional Air Rifle Individual Championship.

Provided by: The National Rifle Association

Winner: Gold NRA Sectional Medallion - and 15 award points (**min. of 5 competitors**)

2nd place: Silver NRA Sectional Medallion - and 10 award points (**min. of 10 competitors**)

3rd place: Bronze NRA Sectional Medallion - and 5 award points (**min. of 15 competitors**)

***NOTE:** An individual or team winning a place award will not be entitled to a class award in the same match. Such class awards will be passed down to the next eligible individual or team.*

**CLASS AWARDS:** Separate class awards will be given for SH1, SH2 and SH3:

First in class – Gold NRA Class Medallion (5 competitors minimum).

Second in class – Silver NRA Class Medallion (8 competitors minimum).

Third in class – Bronze NRA Class Medallion (11 competitors minimum).

**NOTE:**

- *If there are fewer than 5 entries in a class, they will be combined with the next higher class.*
- *If there are not enough entries after combining two classes, competitors will shoot for **open awards only**.*
- *An individual winning a place award (Winner, 2nd or 3rd) will not be entitled to a class award in the same match. Such class awards will be passed down to the next eligible individual.*

MATCH 2: Sectional Air Rifle Team Championship. Total of firing member's scores will be taken from Match 1

Winning Team: 30 NRA award points (with 2 or more teams)  
15 NRA award points (with 5 or more teams)

\*SPONSOR AWARDS FOR MATCHES: Sponsors furnish the type of awards they choose for Matches 1 & 2, in addition to NRA furnished awards. *(Optional)*

**INTERNATIONAL AIR RIFLE NATIONAL AWARDS**

MATCH 3: National Disabled Air Rifle Individual Championship. Scores will be taken from Match 1

Provided by: The National Rifle Association

Winner: Gold NRA Sectional Medallion - and 15 award points (**min. of 5 competitors**)  
2nd place: Silver NRA Sectional Medallion - and 10 award points (**min. of 10 competitors**)  
3rd place: Bronze NRA Sectional Medallion - and 5 award points (**min. of 15 competitors**)

High Junior: 20 Award Points  
High Woman: 20 Award Points  
High Senior: 20 Award Points

An individual or team winning a place award will not be entitled to a class award in the same match. Such class awards will be passed down to the next eligible individual or team.

**CLASS AWARDS:** Separate class awards will be provided for SH1, SH2 and SH3:

First in class – Gold NRA Class Medallion (5 competitors minimum).  
Second in class – Silver NRA Class Medallion (8 competitors minimum).  
Third in class – Bronze NRA Class Medallion (11 competitors minimum).

**NOTE:**

- *If there are fewer than 5 entries in a class, they will be combined with the next higher class.*
- *If there are not enough entries after combining two classes, competitors will shoot for **open awards only**.*
- *An individual winning a place award (Winner, 2nd or 3rd) will not be entitled to a class award in the same match. Such class awards will be passed down to the next eligible individual.*

MATCH 4: National Disabled Air Rifle Team Championship. Score will be taken from Match 2

Provided by: The National Rifle Association

Winning Team: 30 NRA award points (with 2 or more teams)  
15 NRA award points (with 5 or more teams)

#### IV. PRECISION 3-POSITION AIR RIFLE SECTIONAL

**RULES:** Current NRA Precision Air Rifle Rules will govern.

**DISTANCE FIRED:** 10 meters

**RIFLE:** Air Rifle - Rule 3.1

**SIGHTS:** Metallic - Rule 3.7

**TARGETS:** NRA Official 10 meters; AR-5 series 2003 or later (or electronic target)

**INDIVIDUAL ENTRIES:** Open to Adults and Juniors with physical disabilities (NRA membership is not required.)

**TEAM ENTRIES:** Open to teams whose firing members represent a club affiliated with NRA (Rule 2.11 or 2.11.1), a Regular Service unit, National Guard, or Reserves (Rule 2.13), VA hospital or transition facility. A team composed of competitors who are not all in the same classification is a mixed team. Mixed team in sectionals may fire for score with the majority of classifications dictating their class.

A team will consist of three (3) firing members representing a club as defined by Rule 2.11, 2.13, or 2.14. Pick up teams composed of shooters who cannot prove membership in the same club or group (Rule 2.10), will not be allowed to participate. Since team matches are unfired (paper team match), all teams MUST be named and entered **BEFORE** any member of the team begins individual firing. Alternates must also be named before firing and used to substitute only for someone who has not yet fired.

**TIME LIMITS:** As specified in NRA rule 8.2.

Prone:	20 shots – 30 min. (1½ min. per shot)
Standing:	20 shots – 40 min. (2 min. per shot)
Kneeling:	20 shots – 30 min. (1½ min. per shot)

**NOTE:** Time allowed includes sighting shots. Time remaining from one position may not be carried over to a following position regardless of the method of changing targets. When two targets are hung at one time, a three minute target change is not permitted.

MATCH 2: Individual match – 20 shots, standing  
MATCH 3: Individual Match – 20 shots, kneeling  
MATCH 4: The Sectional Individual Championship (an aggregate of matches 1, 2 & 3)  
MATCH 5: The Sectional Team Championship (an aggregate of each team member's scores in Match 4)  
MATCH 6: The National Precision 3-Position Air Rifle Individual c  
Championship.  
MATCH 7: The National Precision 3-Position Air rifle Team Championship.

#### **PRECISION 3-POSITION SECTIONAL AWARDS:**

MATCH 4: The Sectional Individual Championship (an aggregate of matches 1, 2 & 3)  
Provided by: The National Rifle Association

Winner:	Gold NRA Sectional Medallion - and 15 award points ( <b>minimum of 5 competitors</b> )
2nd place:	Silver NRA Sectional Medallion - and 10 award points ( <b>minimum of 10 competitors</b> )
3rd place:	Bronze NRA Sectional Medallion - and 5 award points ( <b>minimum of 15 competitors</b> )

An individual or team winning a place award will not be entitled to a class award in the same match. Such class awards will be passed down to the next eligible individual or team.

**CLASS AWARDS:** Separate class awards will be provided for SH1, SH2 and SH3:

First in class – Gold NRA Class Medallion (5 competitors minimum).  
Second in class – Silver NRA Class Medallion (8 competitors minimum).  
Third in class – Bronze NRA Class Medallion (11 competitors minimum).

**NOTE:**

- If there are fewer than 5 entries in a class, they will be combined with the next higher class.
- If there are not enough entries after combining two classes, competitors will shoot for **open awards only**.
- An individual winning a place award (Winner, 2nd or 3rd) will not be entitled to a class award in the same match. Such class awards will be passed down to the next eligible individual.

**MATCH 5:** The Sectional Team Championship (an aggregate of each team member's scores in Match 4)  
**Provided by:** The National Rifle Association

Winning Team: 30 NRA award points (with 2 or more teams)  
15 NRA award points (with 5 or more teams)

***NOTE:** There is no entry fee for Matches 6 & 7. The entry is automatic with entry in Matches 4&5 of each Sectional Tournament. Scores from Match 4&5 will be used for these matches.*

\***SPONSOR AWARDS FOR MATCHES:** Sponsors furnish the type of awards they choose for Matches 1 & 2, in addition to NRA furnished awards. (*Optional*)

**PRECISION 3-POSITION NATIONAL AWARDS**

**MATCH 6:** The National Precision 3-Position Air Rifle Individual Championship  
**Provided by:** The National Rifle Association

Winner: Gold NRA Sectional Medallion - and 15 award points (**min. of 5 competitors**)

3rd place: Bronze NRA Sectional Medallion - and 5 award points (**min. of 15 competitors**)

High Junior: 20 Award Points  
High Woman: 20 Award Points  
High Senior: 20 Award Points

An individual or team winning a place award will not be entitled to a class award in the same match. Such class awards will be passed down to the next eligible individual or team.

**CLASS AWARDS:** Separate class awards will be provided for SH1, SH2 and SH3:

First in class – Gold NRA Class Medallion (5 competitors minimum).  
Second in class – Silver NRA Class Medallion (8 competitors minimum).

## V. INTERNATIONAL AIR PISTOL SECTIONAL MATCHES

**RULES:** Current NRA International Style Pistol Rules will govern.

**DISTANCE FIRED:** 10 meters

**RIFLE:** Air Pistol - Rule 3.7

**SIGHTS:** Open - Rule 3.1

**TARGETS:** NRA Official 10 meters; B-10 International 10 meter target

**INDIVIDUAL ENTRIES:** Open to Adults and Juniors (as state laws permit) with physical disabilities (NRA membership is not required.)

**TEAM ENTRIES:** Open to teams whose firing members represent a club affiliated with NRA (Rule 2.11 or 2.11.1), a Regular Service unit, National Guard, or Reserves (Rule 2.13), VA hospital or transition facility. A team composed of competitors who are not all in the same classification is a mixed team. Mixed team in sectionals may fire for score with the majority of classifications dictating their class.

A team will consist of three (3) firing members representing a club as defined by Rule 2.11, 2.13, or 2.14. Pick up teams composed of shooters who cannot prove membership in the same club or group (Rule 2.10), will not be allowed to participate. Since team matches are unfired (paper team match), all teams MUST be named and entered **BEFORE** any member of the team begins individual firing. Alternates must also be named before firing and used to substitute only for someone who has not yet fired.

**TIME LIMITS:** 60 Shots Standing = 105 Minutes (Note Rule 7.5(e)), to Include Sighting Shots.

*NOTE: There is no entry fee for Matches 3 & 4. The entry is automatic with entry in Matches 1 & 2 of each Sectional Tournament.*

2nd place: Silver NRA Sectional Medallion - and 10 award points (**min. of 10 competitors**)

3rd place: Bronze NRA Sectional Medallion - and 5 award points (**min. of 15 competitors**)

High Junior: 20 Award Points

High Woman: 20 Award Points

High Senior: 20 Award Points

An individual or team winning a place award will not be entitled to a class award in the same match. Such class awards will be passed down to the next eligible individual or team.

**CLASS AWARDS:** Separate class awards will be provided for SH1, SH2 and SH3:

First in class – Gold NRA Class Medallion (5 competitors min).

Second in class – Silver NRA Class Medallion (8 competitors min.).

Third in class – Bronze NRA Class Medallion (11 competitors min.).

**NOTE:**

- *If there are fewer than 5 entries in a class, they will be combined with the next higher class.*
- *If there are not enough entries after combining two classes, competitors will shoot for **open awards only**.*
- *An individual winning a place award (Winner, 2nd or 3rd) will not be entitled to a class award in the same match. Such class awards will be passed down to the next eligible individual.*
