

2010 NRA National Junior Indoor Sectional Championships

The NRA National Junior Indoor Rifle Championships will officially start January 1, 2010 and conclude April 18, 2010. The Championships are comprised of Sectionals where competitors can compete in their local area under the same rules and conditions required of all the other Sectionals that are conducted across the United States. Scores from each Sectional are sent to the NRA; winning targets are validated by the NRA; and the NRA publishes the National Championship winners.

Six National Junior Rifle Indoor Sectional Championships are conducted annually and include: NRA 3-Position, 4-Position, Air Rifle Standing, Air Rifle Precision 3-Position, Air Rifle Sporter 3-Position and Sporter Air Rifle Standing. (New this year). The Championships are the largest event in the US for junior competitors. A bulletin showing National Award Winners and a complete listing of all competitors and their scores is compiled and the official results are available at: www.nrahq.org/compete/champ1.asp.

Juniors may enter only one Junior Sectional tournament of each discipline in each calendar year for official record. Any subsequent Junior Sectional tournaments fired, scorecards MUST be marked "Score Only".

In order for a sectional to be considered for the National Indoor Championships, at least FIVE competitors must compete. If less than five individuals or one team enter there are no awards are given, but the scores may be submitted for classification and as part of the National Junior Indoor Championship results. Juniors may also enter Open Sectionals and Collegiate Sectionals, if eligibility permits.

Applications for Sectionals should be received three months prior to the date of the Sectional for inclusion in *Shooting Sports, USA*. October 1st is the deadline for the January 2010 edition.

This program contains information for the National Junior NRA 3-Position, 4-Position, International Air Rifle, Precision 3-Position Air Rifle, Sporter 3-Position Air Rifle Championships, and Sporter Air Rifle Standing Sectionals and Indoor Championships.

New for the 2010 Shooting Season:

1. The NRA/USA 50 target will replace the A-36 in all 3-Position Smallbore Championships.
2. NRA Sporter Air Rifle Standing Championships.

I. GENERAL CONDITIONS

Sectionals are registered tournaments, and all guidelines for registered tournaments will be followed. Sectionals are operated by match staff composed of local officials. All local challenges and protests are to be resolved on the match site according to procedures outlined in Section 16 of the appropriate NRA Rulebook. Competitors and sponsors are responsible for the content of this program.

The National Indoor Rifle Championships are determined by scores fired in the local Sectional Tournaments that are compiled at NRA Headquarters.

All fired targets must be retained until the challenge period for the National Indoor Rifle Championships Final Results Bulletin has ended, two weeks after the bulletin is posted on-line.

The top three individual's targets and the top team's targets must be sent into NRA Headquarters for verification.

Individual Matches - Open to any individual who meets the eligibility requirements of NRA Rule 2.3.

Competitors may fire in all six championships. If a competitor competes in the same discipline more than once, only the first official score is allowed. The competitor must declare prior to firing subsequent matches that the score is "for Score Only". NRA will use the first fired sectional score for competitors who fail to declare (by marking their score card "Score Only"). All other reported scores for the same discipline will be disqualified.

Individual Categories (*Only one category may be entered*)

Junior:	Born 1990, 1991, 1992 or later
Intermediate Junior:	Born 1993, 1994 1995 or later
Sub-Junior:	Born 1996 or later
JROTC:	Military Cadet from a high school or JROTC unit who is eligible under Rule 2.3.

Team Matches - Open to any club who meets the eligibility requirements of NRA Rule 2.3 and 2.11(a).

Teams may enter any Sectional tournament, but may fire in only one of each discipline of Sectional during the same calendar year. Teams must fire their score at one location.

Team Categories - Teams are entered in categories according to the age group or organization which the team represents. The following definitions apply to the five categories in the Junior Sectionals: (**A single team may enter only one category.**)

Teams MUST meet Rule 2.11 and PRACTICE together on a regular basis as well as shoot tournaments together. NO PICK-UP TEAMS!!

1. **Junior:** Teams comprised wholly of members who are eligible under Rule 2.3 and belong to the same club.
2. **Intermediate Junior:** Teams comprised wholly of members who are eligible under NRA Rule 2.3.1 and belong to the same club.
3. **Sub-Junior:** Teams comprised wholly of members who are eligible under NRA Rule 2.3.2 and belong to the same club.
4. **Scholastic:** Teams comprised wholly of members attending the same school and belonging to the school-sponsored club (**Rule 2.17**).
5. **Military Scholastic:** Teams comprised wholly of Military Cadets from clubs representing military schools, military cadet organizations, or Junior ROTC units (**In order to be eligible to shoot on a JROTC Team, an individual must have entered in the JROTC individual category**).

Mixed Teams - Teams that are not comprised wholly of members within the same age category will enter in the age category of the oldest member.

Teams that are not comprised wholly of members within the JROTC category and representing the same high school may enter their team in the scholastic category.

NRA Membership Number - In order to enter scores of competitors in the computer classification system, an NRA number must be used. If you are a member of NRA, indicate your membership number. If you are not an NRA Member, use your classification card number if one has been assigned. If a special number has not been assigned, NRA will assign one when an accumulation of shots is sufficient (rule 19.15).

Firing Dates - Junior Sectionals are scheduled between **January 1 and April 18, 2010**. NOTE: Scores received after April 26th, will not be included in the National results.

Entries - Entries should be made at least 14 days preceding the firing date. Late entries may be accepted to range capacity. Contact the sponsor of the Sectional you wish to attend for specific information.

Scoring - Scoring will be done by the Sectional Statistical Office and all doubtful shots **will** be plugged. Scoring on *all* air rifle shots will be done with the "**Outward**" Gauge. (NRA International Rifle Rules, 14.3 (b), except inner tens and shots in the one and two ring.) (NRA Position Air Rifle Rule 14).

Challenges - A challenge fee not to exceed \$3.00 per stage may be charged for each challenge made in any position Individual Match. In Team Matches, a challenge fee not to exceed \$3.00 for each team member's score may be charged. See NRA Rule 16. A charge of \$3.00 per individual or \$12.00 per team will be made to challenge another person or team's score.

The challenge period may not end until a reasonable time after the last relay has fired the last shot.

Note: Challenges will be made in accordance with Section 16 of the appropriate rulebook.

Souvenir Awards - Each firing competitor in the Sectional Tournament will be given a souvenir pin to recognize his or her participation.

Sectional Awards - Awards furnished by NRA are as shown in this program. All awards will be made as shown in this schedule. The overall high scoring individual(s) and team will be awarded the Sectional Championship Awards regardless of any categories entered. All category awards will then be passed down to the next eligible competitor or/team within that category, as long as there is still enough competitors/teams remaining in that category to issue an award.

National Bulletin - The National Junior Indoor Championship Bulletin will list all individual competitors and teams ranked according to score within a category that were received within the stated time period. Final results will be posted on the Competitions website: www.nrahq.org/compete/champ1.asp

NRA Presidents 100 - National Rifle Association Presidents 100 is a special award given to competitors who placed in the top 100 in either the NRA 3-Position Smallbore or 4-Position Smallbore National Junior Indoor Championship. An award is presented to each competitor to commemorate this accomplishment. An award is also presented to competitors who placed in the top 10% in either International Air Rifle, 3-Position Precision Air Rifle or 3-Position Sporter Air Rifle (not to exceed 100).

*** * AWARDS SCHEDULE FOR ALL JUNIOR SECTIONAL EVENTS * ***

Individual Awards

Sectional Champion: The competitor firing the highest score overall will receive a Gold Sectional Medallion. **(Minimum of 5 competitors)**

2nd Place: The competitor firing the 2nd highest score overall will receive a Silver Sectional Medallion. **(Provided there is a minimum of 10 competitors.)**

3rd Place: The competitor firing the 3rd highest score overall will receive a Bronze Sectional Medallion. **(Provided there is a minimum of 15 competitors.)**

The remaining competitors will be placed in their categories and awards given based on the following formula:

2 to 4 entries	1 st place	21 to 25 entries	5 th place
5 to 10 entries	2 nd place	26 to 30 entries	6 th place
11 to 15 entries	3 rd place	31 to 35 entries	7 th place
16 to 20 entries	4 th place	over 36 entries	8 th place

Categories will **only** be combined when there are less than two competitors or one team representing the category. Categories are established only after the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Overall winners are removed from the competitor pool.

Team Awards

Winning Team: Gold Medals (3 in Air Rifle), minimum of 2 teams.

The remaining teams are assigned to a category of age or JROTC or Scholastic and awards are given based on the following formula:

2 to 4 teams (in a category) = **1st place 4 Silver Medals** (3 in Air Rifle)
5 to 10 teams (in a category) = **2nd place 4 Bronze Medals** (3 in Air Rifle)
11 or more (in a category) = **3rd place 4 Bronze Medals** (3 in Air Rifle)

Categories will only be combined where there is only one team in a category. (Categories are established only after the winning team is removed from the competitor pool). Categories will be combined based on the following formula:

The above awards will be given to the high scoring eligible competitors regardless of category indicated on entry card.

Category Awards: All other competitors will be placed in one category as follows: All JROTC competitors will be placed in the JROTC category, and Collegiate placed in the Collegiate Category. Collegiate competitors are eligible for category awards only, not overall awards. Non-JROTC competitors will be placed in the age category indicated on their scorecard. Category awards will be given to the high scoring competitors who have not received one of the awards listed above. Awards will be given in each category (**Based on participation: 2 competitors= 1 award; 10 competitors= 2 awards; 15 competitors= 3 awards; 20 competitors= 4 awards; 25 competitors=5 awards**). An additional award will be given for each 25 competitors in a category over a minimum of 25.

Category Awards: To the highest ranking teams in the Junior, Intermediate Junior, Sub-Junior, Scholastic, Military Scholastic and Collegiate categories: 4 special awards. Awards based on participation--2 Teams=1 award; 5 Teams=2 awards; 10 Teams=3 awards; 15 Teams=4 awards; 20 Team=5 awards.

One additional award will be given for each additional 20 teams in a category over a minimum of 20 teams. Only one category award will be given per team.

B. NRA 3-POSITION SMALLBORE SECTIONAL MATCH CONDITIONS

INDIVIDUAL

Course of Fire: 20 shots in each of the following positions: prone, standing, and kneeling, one shot per bull's-eye. The positions must be fired in the order listed above.

Rules: Current NRA Smallbore Rifle Rules will govern the conduct of these tournaments.

Rifle: Rule 3.2, Any Rifle

Positions: Rule 5.6, 5.10 and 5.12

Sights: Rule 3.7(a) Metallic only.

Firing Distance: 50 feet.

Sighting Shots: Unlimited sighting shots are permitted, but all shots fired, sighters and record, must be fired within the time allowed for record firing.

Time Limit: Prone: 1 minute per record shot. **Standing:** 2 minutes per record shot. **Kneeling:** 1 ½ minutes per record shot. **(Rule 8.2)**

Each 20-shot stage (position) will be timed separately. If two targets cannot be hung at one time or if target carriers are not available, each 10-shot string will be timed separately. There will be a 5-minute equipment change and a 3-minute preparation period between stages (Rule 8.2).

Target: Official NRA/USA A50. Targets may be hung at any height within range limitations.

Tie Scores: Ties will be broken using Rule 15.7 (a), then 15.7(d), then 15.7(e), then 15.7(f) until ties are broken.

Entry Fee: \$12.00 Suggested, per competitor

Awards: Provided by the NRA (PAGES 5-6).

TEAM MATCH

Team Matches: Open to teams consisting of four (4) firing members and a Team Captain (who must be designated) who may also be a firing member of the Team. The Team must represent a single club (Rule 2.11). The Team Coach may be an adult. **A competitor may not fire on more than one team in any one Sectional or Sectional type in a given year.**

Team Entries: The team match is not a fired match. Team entry cards must have the names of all team members and alternate listed, and be submitted to the entry office **before** any member of the team begins individual match firing. A team is not required to fire on the same relay. An alternate may be named and substituted for any named team member as long as it is before either person has fired.

Course of Fire: An aggregate of scores fired by team members in the individual match. Team members must be designated before firing the individual match. "Team Only" competitors may shoot on a space available basis only. Their scores **will not** count for individual competition.

Team Tied Scores: Will be broken using Rule 15.8.

Entry Fee: \$12.00 Suggested, per team

Coaching: Not permitted during firing. (Rule 9.10)

Awards: Provided by the NRA (PAGES 7-8).

B. 4-POSITION SMALLBORE SECTIONAL MATCH CONDITIONS

INDIVIDUAL

Course of Fire: 10 shots in each of the following positions: prone, standing, sitting and kneeling. **The positions must be fired in the order listed.** One shot per bull's-eye.

Rules: Current NRA Smallbore Rifle rules will govern the conduct of these tournaments.

Rifle: Rule 3.2, Any rifle (3.1 if Club Regulation Requires)

Sights: Rule 3.7(a) Metallic only.

Firing Distance: 50 feet

Sighting Shots: Unlimited sighting shots are permitted, but all shots fired, sighters and record, must be fired within the time allowed for record firing.

Time Limits: Firing time is one minute per record shot in each position except standing, which is 1 ½ minutes per shot. Each 10 shot string will be timed separately. There will be a 5 minute equipment change and a 3 minute preparation period between stages (Rule 8.2).

Target: Official NRA A-17 targets may be hung at any height within range limitations.

Tie Scores: Ties will be broken in accordance with Rule 15.

Entry Fee: **\$12.00** Suggested, per competitor

Awards: Provided by the NRA (PAGES 5-6).

TEAM MATCH

Team Matches: Open to teams consisting of four (4) firing members and a Team Captain (who must be designated), who may also be a firing member of the Team. The Team must represent a single club (Rule 2.11). The Team Coach may be an adult. **A competitor may not fire on more than one team in any one Sectional or Sectional type in a given year.**

Team Entries: The Team Match is not a fired match. Team entry cards must have the names of all team members and alternate listed, and be submitted to the Entry Office **before** any member of the team begins individual match firing. A team is not required to fire on the same relay. An alternate may be named and substituted for any named team member as long as it is before either person has fired. (Rule 12.4)

Course of Fire: It will be an aggregate of scores fired by team members in the individual match. Team members must be designated before firing the individual match. "Team Only" competitors may shoot on a space available basis only. Their scores **will not** count for individual competition.

Tied Team Scores: Will be broken using Rule 15.8.

Entry Fee: **\$12.00** Suggested, per team

Coaching: Not permitted during firing (Rule 9.10).

Awards: Provided by the NRA (PAGES 7-8).

Course of Fire: 40 shots standing, one shot per bull's-eye.

Rules: Current NRA International Rifle Rules will govern the conduct of these tournaments.

Rifle: Rule 3.6, Air Rifle

Sights: rule 3.7, Metallic only

Firing Distance: 10 meters

Sighting Shots: Rule 9.2

Time Limits: 75 minutes using single bull or electronic targets (20 min. per target using 10 bull targets).

Target: Official NRA AR-5 series targets must be used-Target height may be adjusted for position and competitor height.

Tie Scores: Will be broken by rule 15.3.

Entry Fee: **\$12.00** Suggested, per competitor

Awards: Provided by the NRA (PAGES 5-6).

TEAM MATCH

Team Matches: Open to teams consisting of three (3) firing members and a designated Team Captain (who must be designated) who may also be a firing member of the team. The Team must represent a single club. The Team Coach may be an adult. **A competitor may not fire on more than one team in any one Sectional or Sectional type in a given year.**

Team Entries: The team match is **not** a fired match. Team entry cards must have the names of all team members and alternate listed, and be submitted to the entry office **before** any member of the team begins individual match firing. An alternate may be named and substituted for any named team member as long as it is before either person has fired. (Rule 12.4)

Course of Fire: An aggregate of scores fired by team members in the individual match. Team members must be designated before firing the individual match. "Team Only" competitors may shoot on a space available basis only. Their scores **will not** count for individual competition.

Tied Team Scores: Will be broken using Rule 15.5

Entry Fee: **\$12.00** Suggested, per team

Coaching: Not permitted during firing (Rule 9.10).

Awards: Provided by the NRA (PAGES 5-6).
